Together, our organizations typically make available three or four \$1,000 education scholarships to eligible applicants who are AFT Washington members in good standing, or spouses, domestic partners, children, or dependents of AFT Washington members in good standing. Qualified applicants must plan to attend an institution of higher education during the 2016-2017 academic year for the purpose of obtaining a degree or certification. A scholarship committee reviews the applications for eligibility and determines

the winners.
